"Whitewater Slalom Canoe C1 Champion. Davey Hearn dominated the top levels of canoe slalom for over a decade (with Jon Lugbill), revolutionizing the sport while producing innovations in paddling technique and boat design. His return to the top of the podium in 1995 for a second individual World Championship title ten years after his first, along with three Olympic appearances underscores his influence on the sport over his 26 year competitive career. Davey Hearn continues to motivate and teach slalom athletes today in a career as a coach."
