"Whitewater Slalom Canoe C1 Champion, Jon Lugbill dominated the top levels of canoe slalom for over a decade (with Davey Hearn), revolutionizing the sport while producing innovations in paddling technique and boat design. Lugbill is a five-time World Champion in C1 slalom, and the only athlete in history to have won a record twelve World Championship gold medals. Lugbill is generally recognized as the best paddler to ever compete in whitewater canoeing, and he is the only paddler to appear on the Wheaties box."
